Beep beep ringtone free

The first step in adding ringing tones to your phone is to find one you like. Generally, this means checking out one of the dozens of ringleader sites on the Internet and choosing a good one that's compatible with your phone model. Some websites charge for their use of ringing tones, to close song royalties, among other things, and some websites provide tones for free. Many older songs (such as classic pieces) have been pretty long that their copyrights have expired -- they've entered the public domain, so they're free to use by anyone. Once you find the ringing tone you like, you just have to get it into the memory of your phone. There are several different ways to do this, depending on your specific phone model. The three main ways to add new ringtones are: Ads Load ring tone programs into phones from computers, via data cables. Send the program to the phone via airwaves. Type a program into the phone directly, using the keypad. Phones can use one particular method exclusively, but many phones have a wide range of options. Check your instructions manual to find out what your phone can do. If you have the correct phone, software and computer configuration, loading tones through data links or infurah interfaces may be the easiest option, but it requires some work and expense to set everything at first. A more popular method is sending new ringtones to your phone via airwaves. This approach comes from Nokia, but other manufacturers have added this capability to their phones. The basic idea is to send a phone of a special type of text message containing programs for ringing tones -- in most phones, this is done using either a Short Messaging Service or Enhanced Messaging Service technology. Nokia originally developed a Short Messaging Service to send a short text message between phones. Then, Nokia and Intel create smart messaging, special protocols for sending functional, non-text information via SMS. Basically, smart SMS messages are encoded to allow phones equipped to recognize them as graphics, ringing tones, etc. The most common method for transferring ringtones through airwaves is to visit ringtone Web sites, choose tones, enter your phone number and let site administrators send messages to your phone directly. Alternatively, you can use the SMS gateway site to send certain messages to your own phone. This means finding code for the narring you want, searching in a suitable format (Nokia Binary format, for example) and copying it as a smart message.
